Earmarked for completion in early 2011, the development will consist of seven one bedroom apartments, a multi-purpose unit, a gym and therapy room for ongoing rehabilitation and therapy.

The Gold Coast Apartments are Youngcare’s second accommodation project and will set new and innovative standards in residential care for young people.

Youngcare will again be partnering with expert care providers Wesley Mission Brisbane who will deliver the Youngcare model of care which cater closely to the medical, emotional and social needs of a young person requiring 24/7 care with an illness or injury.

With 6,500 young Australians currently residing in aged care, and another 700,000 being cared for at home by family and friends, the Youngcare Apartments Gold Coast will provide a ray of hope as Youngcare continues to provide relevant and dignified care options for young Australians with 24/7 care needs.
